

Policy Statement

The City of St. Louis, DIVISION OF POLICE, is committed to comply with 49 C.F.R. part 21 and 49 C.F.R. part 303 and assures nondiscrimination compliance, on the grounds of race, color, national origin including limited English proficiency, sex, age, disability, or income, as provided by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1973, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Age Discrimination Act of 1975, Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, Executive Order 12898 (Environmental Justice), and Executive Order 13166 (Limited English Proficiency).

As referenced in the Title VI Program Assurances, no person shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any City of St. Louis, DIVISION OF POLICE, program or activity. Efforts will be made to ensure nondiscrimination in all of its programs and activities, whether those programs and activities are federally funded or not.

The City of St. Louis, DIVISION OF POLICE, has delegated the authority to administer and monitor the Title VI Program as promulgated under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and any subsequent legislation to the Law Department, Police Section, City of St. Louis, who has assigned a person to serve as the Title VI Program Coordinator.
