St. Louis City Street Closures for Annual Parade
Christmas in St. Louis Parade

Christmas in St. Louis, Inc. will sponsor its annual "Christmas in St. Louis Parade" on Thursday, November 22, 2007 and more than 3,000 people, 15 bands, and 130 floats are expected to participate in the parade.

The parade begins at 8:30 a.m., at Broadway & Washington and proceeds east on Washington to 4th Street then south on 4th Street to Market and then west on Market to 14th Street where the parade ends.

The following streets will be closed for this event. **No parking will be allowed on these streets and vehicles parked in these areas will be ticketed and towed.**

STREET CLOSURES

4th Street from Washington to Market will be closed on Thursday November 22, 2007 beginning at 5:00am.

Market from Memorial Drive to Broadway will be closed on Thursday November 22, 2007 beginning at 5:00am.

Convention Plaza from Broadway to 7th will be closed beginning at 6:00 P.M. on Wednesday, November 21, 2007 and will be closed until the completion of the parade on Thursday, November 22, 2007.

15th Street from Pine to Walnut and Walnut from 15th to 16th will be closed beginning at 5:00am on Thursday, November 22, 2007.
